Health Equity PubMed Search Box

Incorporating material on health inequalities into course content is important for students to develop a comprehensive understanding of public health issues and prepare to work in a diverse society. To facilitate this, a new literature search box has been added to the Instructor Resource page of the intranet. The search box makes it easy to retrieve articles from PubMed that focus on health disparities in a given public health subject area. The search box is located on the Faculty Resource section of the SPH Intranet as well as the Resource section of the Health Equity Work Group website.
