 - i. Create specific resumes for positions based on the longer, master resume
 - ii. Federal positions want you to go 10 years back on your resume
 - b. A ready to go resume that is generic and 2 pages
 - c. A fluid resume that you tailor for specific employers
 - ii. Include student experiences on resume
 - 1. In conversations/interviews, quantify your work with senate (and other groups).
 - a. Provide evidence that represents your experience with student senate. List the skills and context for what you do

- b. Include scope and numbers if possible
- c. Create a document for yourself that documents your responsibilities and actions on senate
- d. Field any questions that the Senate might have as time allows

 - a. Developing a way to check and fix the air ventilators
 - 2. Biden's executive order related to vaccines requires proof of vaccines for faculty, staff, GAs, RAs, etc.
 - ii. Anti-Discrimination Resolution (Caste-system)
 - 1. Caste-system is a new protected identity
 - iii. Raising the Minimum Wage
 - 1. Talk among undergraduate students to write a resolution to increase minimum wage for GAs, RAs, etc.
