NON-DEGREE SEEKING STUDENT

Registration Begins on March 2, 2023

Students who have not been admitted to a graduate level program at the University of Minnesota are considered non-degree seeking students. If you are in this category and are interested in earning graduate credit you must submit a "Registration Request for Graduate Credit" form: z.umn.edu/gradcredit.
