 - a. Intros: Name, program, committee(s)
 - b. Dean Pettigrew introduction
 - c. Questions for SPHSS:
 - i. Feedback about credit # for different programs
 - 1. How has this policy impacted your time at SPH? Is there a benefit to having different credit requirements for different programs?
 - a. The school is so silo'd: where do we need to bridge silos between programs? (what skills do students want to get?)
 - b. Paying per credit:
 - i. Need to evaluate how much a 4 (versus 2-) credit course adds to total credit numbers
 - ii. Impacts what courses you take- can take classes that you enjoy and that make a more well-rounded professional
 - c. Flat rate:
 - i. Flexibility to add a minor or take extra electives without paying more
 - d. Flexibility with number of electives and availability of elective courses differs between programs
 - e. Understanding credit requirements varies between programs and depends on program coordinator
 - f. Inconsistent Master's projects between programs
 - g. GPAS/APAS tracker doesn't work for credit and course planning
 - h. Classes being listed and then cancelled makes course planning difficult

 - i. Inclusion of accessibility into DEI
 - 1. Making it clear that accessibility is a priority (disability justice)
 - 2. Inclusion disability justice in coursework
 - 3. Incorporating universal design principles into building planning
