AMERICAN INDIAN PUBLIC HEALTH & WELLNESS CERTIFICATE

The American Indian Health & Wellness Certificate prepares students to understand how to work respectfully and effectively with Tribes and American Indian communities. The Certificate program does not require registration as a "student." It is specifically designed for working professionals with a baccalaureate degree, generally working in state or county health departments, or other organizations that may need to learn protocols for working with Tribes or understanding the many cultures of Tribal governments and their citizens. All courses are offered via Zoom. Students must complete minimum 12 credits. Courses not on this list of electives may be considered upon petition and approval of the Program Director. Students must take the required courses for A/F and achieve a grade of B- or above. Electives can be taken either A/F or S/N. Students must achieve a grade of B- or above in elective courses taken A/F.
