## **GLOBAL HEALTH MINOR**

The Global Health Minor provides students with knowledge, skills, and attitudes to address health issues that transcend national boundaries and to develop and implement solutions that require global cooperation. Students take public health courses that focus on the population health skills necessary to promote the health, well-being, and safety of global and local levels. There are 7 credits for Masters students. There are 12 credits for Doctoral students. Master's and Doctoral students will select electives in consultation with Director of Graduate Studies. All required minor coursework must be taken A/F and achieve a grade of B- or above. Elective courses may be taken either A/F or S/N. Students must achieve a grade of B- or above for elective credits taken A/F. Graduate credits can be applied toward either the major or the minor/other requirement, but not both. Courses not on this list of electives may be considered upon petition and approval of the Director of Graduate Studies.
